Old Business	
	Still determining the best way to move the docks in/out on the ramps as the water level changes.
	Parking is an ongoing issue; had planned to extend parking south, past the shed. With the sale and then purchase of the property adjacent to the south side of our parking lot by a private entity this project has been put on hold. First to determine the survey lines and now weather.
	Proposed development: Members are still expressing concerns over the influx of traffic, law enforcement, trespassing, etc. At the lake - we are already understaffed, porta jons only currently support the traffic we have; we will need to purchase, or rent more. Concerns continue regarding the parking problem and the potential for a child to be injured. Another concern is the fact that lake use rules are all based on ownership - not property renters.

### New Business

There is a need to re-visit the lake's liability policy to make certain there is coverage for anyone injured while swimming, boating, etc.

We currently have 12 wet docks. All but two are reserved for the 2020 season and there is a wait list of 9 more. Had considered adding more wet dock space to accommodate some on the wait list but there are concerns regarding the number of boats on the lake now as well as the lake area that would be taken up by more slips. More information needs to be gathered before deciding if more wet slips should be added.

**Silver Creek Irrigation District (SCID) Agreement:** I was invited to a meeting between our member of the BOD (Jason Whiting) in October to discuss the White Mountain Lake District Agreement (WMLCRID) with SCID. I was unable to attend but understand that the SCID was asked to submit copies of their recent electric bills and repairs to the five pumps they use when the lake level reaches the agreement level of 24 feet. To date, I believe we are still waiting for the receipts from SCID.
